Catholic Schools Week

Next Monday at 9.00am we invite all parents, grandparents and family to attend our Prayer Assembly and Open Classrooms. This will be an opportunity to see what we focus on here **at St FInbar's: We are a faith community and we are a community of learners**. Enrolment forms for 2017 will also be available. Please let any of your friends and neighbours know about this opportunity to visit and to collect an enrolment package. You might like to let them know that in 2017 we will have a Before and After Care facility on site at St Finbar's. Over the next couple of weeks we will be providing school tours for the local preschool staff and families interested in joining our community in 2017.

National Young Leaders Day

Yesterday morning our School Captains, Mrs Berger and myself caught the 6:59am train to be at Allphones Arena in Olympic Park for the National Young Leaders Day. "The National Young Leaders Day" is an annual event founded in 1997 to develop strong leadership values amongst young Australians. The Program consists of keynote talks, multimedia presentations and interactive learning that seeks a range of specific outcomes for young people who aspire to lead themselves & others well." Some of the speakers were Commissioner Andrew Scipione, Mr Ben Austin (Australia's most successful Paralympian in swimming) and Mr Scott Tweedie (ABC 3). Daily Attendance

It is important for all students to attend school each day. School attendance for the whole day is a legal requirement. I ask that any appointments etc, for your child are made outside of school hours which is between 8.57am—3.10pm. Unless there is an urgent matter requiring your child to leave school early, we require a written request to the Principal in advance of the leave.

SCHOOL ABSENCES

When your child is absent, on their return to school please send a note explaining the reason. It is a requirement of roll marking that all absences, both whole day and part day, are explained by a parent/carer in writing. These notes should be received by the student's teacher within 3 days, or the absence is recorded as unexplained absence. Notes should be written and signed by the parent/carer and should be dated.

Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta Student Attendance Guidelines EVERY DAY COUNTS

The CEDP Attendance Guidelines are based on current legislative requirements, research on attendance and best practice.

- 1. Children's attendance affects academic achievement and their overall wellbeing. There is **NO safe** threshold of absence EVERY DAY COUNTS.
- 2. School attendance patterns are established early in a child's schooling research shows Year 1 attendance is a predictor of future attendance patterns.
- 3. The effects of school absenteeism accumulate over time and affect children's development now and into the future.
- 4. Sporadic absences can affect academic achievement as much as absences over consecutive days.
- 5. Daily punctuality is important. The early part of each day is critical. Important learning is scheduled during this time when children are rested and receptive. Key concepts are built up in this time.
- 6. We all need to work together with our children's best interests in mind to ensure that students are at school every day and that they are well enough to attend they only get one go at this part of their education and every day counts.

During Term we have our local high schools come to introduce themselves and visit our Stage 3 students . This is the beginning of transition for our students as they finish their Primary years. We will be having a visit from St Columba's and St Dominic's over the next week.

NAPLAN Parent Information Evening / Writing Workshop and P and F Meeting

To help disseminate the information about NAPLAN and answer your questions, we will be holding an information evening for parents before our next P and F Meeting. We will also be presenting a workshop on assisting your child with writing. WHEN: Wednesday 16 March 2016 TIME: 7.00pm WHERE: Learning Centre. All parents are welcome to attend.

What is NAPLAN?

NAPLAN is a National Assessment program in the areas of Literacy and Numeracy. It is held in May each year and is completed by students in Years 3,5,7,and 9. The results of the tests will provide information to schools about what each students can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against national minimum standards. The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 10-12 May 2016.
