Dear St Finbar's Community

This Sunday we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. The Acts of the Apostles recounts the story of the original Pentecost (Acts 2).

Jews from all over were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish feast. On that Sunday, ten days after the Ascension of Our Lord, the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary were gathered in the Upper Room, where they had seen Christ after His Resurrection:

"And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues as it were of fire, and it sat upon every one of them: And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak with diverse tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak." (Acts 2:2-4)

This reading resonates so well with me as it brings back memories of my pilgrimage last year where we actually had the privilege of walking in the footsteps of St Paul. Having celebrated liturgies in Greece, Turkey and Italy and praying with Catholics from around the world, it is amazing to have witness the effects of Pentecost in present society. Any of you who have travelled overseas would also have an insight into the distance Australia is from Europe. How more amazing would it have been in Jesus' time, when transport options were not what they are today. How amazing is the Holy Spirit in providing the gift of courage to the Apostles to carry out their mission of spreading the word of the Lord.

This Sunday at St Finbar's we will also take part in a commissioning ceremony as part of the 9.30am Mass. Each Religious Education Captain, along with a class representative, will light a class candle from the Parish Paschal Candle, the P and F will also light a candle. We will process out with these candles to symbolise Christ, the Light of The World, leaving the community gathered, to spreading the light in our lives at St Finbar's Primary School.

The Mass will be followed by a Family Funday Sunday. The P and F have organised a bbq and fun activities. We look forward to seeing you at this event.

FROM THE LEADER OF LEARNING

Reading at St Finbar's

Reading comprehension is the act of understanding what you are reading. It is an intentional, active, interactive process that occurs before, during and after a person reads a particular piece of writing.

The students have been working hard to develop and practise skills that enable them to comprehend texts. Students are currently learning about **Predicting**. This strategy involves the ability of readers to get meaning from a text by making informed predictions. Good readers use predicting as a way to connect their existing knowledge to new information from a text to get meaning from what they read. Before reading, they may use what they know about an author to predict what a text will be about. The title of a text may trigger memories of texts with similar content, allowing them to predict the content of the new text. During reading, good readers may make predictions about what is going to happen next, or what ideas or evidence the author will present to support an argument. They tend to evaluate these predictions continuously, and revise any prediction that is not confirmed by the reading.

When we predict we can use the

- * Title
- * Front and back covers
- * Blurb
- * Pictures or diagrams
- * Table of contents

We can think about the

- * Topic
- * Author
- * Text form is it a narrative? factual report? recount?

Good readers keep making predictions and adjusting them all through their reading.
