#### Dear St Finbar's Community,

#### How do we ensure a quality education at St Finbar's Glenbrook?

St Finbar's Glenbrook is a faith filled learning community. We are fortunate to be part of a dynamic system of schools known as the Parramatta Diocese.

All Catholic Schools in Parramatta follow a common Religious Education curriculum called "Sharing Our Story". This is based on the shared praxis model. This is further enhanced through our relationship with the Parish

We follow the syllabus as outlined by The Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards NSW (BOSTES)

BOSTES was created by the NSW government in 2014 to sustain and improve the already high standards of achievement in NSW schools.

BOSTES brings together the curriculum, teaching, assessment, registration and policy functions previously provided by the Board of Studies NSW, and the NSW Institute of Teachers.

At St Finbar's Glenbrook, we work collaboratively to provide for the needs our each of our students. The classroom teacher works with a team of professionals, which could include their Stage partner, teacher's aides, Learning Support Teacher, Librarian, Reading Recovery Teacher or EMU Specialist teacher. We are also fortunate to have specialised Creative Arts Teachers and tutors. We also have a school counsellor who visits our school on a weekly basis.

The Leadership Team supports every class in the school. This starts at the planning stage and can also include team teaching, triads (where teachers seek specific feedback on students or strategies used in the classroom). The Leadership Team may also take small groups to work within the class. Case Management also involves a meeting of these professionals to plan future pathways for a child's learning.

In all Parramatta Diocese Schools, additional support is provided for students with specific learning/ behaviour needs and for classes larger than 30. There are support teams from Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) that can be called on if further support is required.

Our teachers are supported with remaining up to date with current research on pedagogy through Professional Development. The CEDP support us in this area by providing opportunities that will assist us in achieving our Implementation Plan Goals. All professional development opportunities are accredited by BOSTES and link to the Australian Professional Standards for Teachers.

As parents, you also contribute to a quality education when you support the work of the school. This is achieved through open communication and respect shown to teachers.

St Finbar's Glenbrook is a rich learning environment and we are fortunate to be members of this community.

At St Finbar's, we always encourage parents to make contact with their child's teacher at any time. ## SAFE USE OF TECHNOLOGY: GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

By taking responsibility for your children's online computer use, parents can greatly minimize any potential risks of being online. Make it a family rule to:

- > If your child is young consider being with your child when he or she is on the Internet.
- > Warn your child not to give out identifying information.
- > Get to know the services your child uses.
- > Never allow a child to arrange a face-to-face meeting with another computer user without parental permission.
- > Remind your children to never respond to messages that are suggestive, obscene, belligerent, threatening, or make them feel uncomfortable.
- > Remember that everything you read online may not be true.
- > Set reasonable rules and guidelines for computer use by your children. Sit down together and create a family computer usage agreement.
- > Consider using parental controls but know their limitations.
- > Keep the computer in a family room rather than the child's bedroom. A computer in a Childs bedroom does not have to be connected to the internet.
- > Supervise and monitor the use of the internet with your family. If issues arise address them quickly

and know who to report problems.

- Encourage and support your family with their use of the internet. Teach them to make right decisions and increase the levels of responsibility as children get older.
- > Understand what a device does before you buy. Make sure any device you purchase is appropriate to the age and experience of your child.
- > Become familiar with the mobile technologies your children use or are introduced to by their friends.
- > Don't give your children mobile phones just for the sake of it inform yourself of all the risks and benefits before making a decision. Don't use prepaid mobile phone accounts if you need to monitor usage or manage SMS addiction.
- ➤ Involve your children in decision-making about internet accounts, mobile phone services and price plans so that they share responsibility for the cost of their activities online.
