The answers can be found in the following commentary presented by Ed Morrissey

" In this miracle Jesus wasn't saying that we don't have to work and plan for our own sustenance. We are called to feed others as well as feeding ourselves, to clothe others as well as ourselves, and so on. But giving in to anxiety and despair paralyzes us so that we can't do *any* of those tasks. We have no faith, we have no hope, and then we have no will or strength to act. Every potential action is preceded with fear, the fear produces hesitation, the hesitation becomes a stall, and so on. We don't feed the multitudes, and eventually we can't deal with our personal responsibilities, either. Instead, Jesus calls us to rely on Him, to put our trust in Him, especially when it comes doing His work. We may look at the poverty and inhumanity of this world and want to give up.

How can we possibly feed the world with just a few loaves of bread and what we've gathered for the local foodshelf? How can we clothe the world from just a few hand-me-downs? How can we evangelize the Good News in a world obsessed with materialism and hate? We cannot, on our own, do those tasks, especially not with the meagre offerings we bring. But Jesus Christ takes those offerings, blesses them, and multiplies them in ways we cannot comprehend nor even see — especially if our anxiety and despair has closed our eyes and our hearts to Him."



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Over Term Three and Four, our Year 3 to 6 teachers will be attending a CEDP four day professional learning course on “Reading 3 to 6”. We are fortunate to have such dedicated teachers who see themselves as learners and strive to meet the individual needs of all students. By attending this professional development as a collaborative team it ensures that we are providing a consistent, contemporary approach to our teaching while providing time for us to reflect on our current pedagogy and make changes where we deem necessary.

How to assist children with bullying.

Bullying is something that most of us experience at some stage in our lives. It is important for parents to assist children identify and voice their concerns.

Parents can provide strategies for their children to become assertive. Not aggressive but assertive! This may include teaching your child to become in control of their feelings by using techniques such as breathing in and out. Your child can then make choices of how they are going to act in a certain situation.

Of course there is the chance that our child is the bully. If your child is displaying bullying behaviour it is important to address this as soon as possible. Speaking with your child is vital to find out what is happening. If your child is bullying others, strategies will be needed for your child in how to deal with responses to meet their needs. Maybe it is a social problem and therefore strategies on how to be accepted and included would be better. If you notice that your child may be a cause for some bullying problems, the school may be able to help.

10 BENEFITS OF READING

1. Kids who read often and widely get better at it.

Practice makes perfect in almost everything we humans do and reading is no different from anything else.

2. Reading exercises our brains.

Reading is a complex task for the human brain. It strengthens brain connections and actually builds new connections.

3. Reading improves concentration.

Children have to sit still and quietly so they can focus on the story when they're reading. If they read regularly, they develop the ability to do this for longer periods.

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4. Reading teaches children about the world around them.

Through reading, children learn about people, places and events outside their own experience. They are exposed to ways of life, ideas and beliefs about the world. This learning is not only important for its own sake but also builds a store of background knowledge which helps younger children learn to read confidently and well.

5. Reading improves a child's vocabulary and leads to more highly developed language skills.

Children learn new words as they read. They absorb information and learn how to structure sentences and how to use words and language effectively.

6. Reading develops a child's imagination.

When we read our brains translate the descriptions we read of people, places and things into pictures. When we're engaged in a story, we're also imagining how the characters are feeling. We use our own experiences to imagine how we would feel in the same situation.

7. Reading helps kids develop empathy.

As we read we can't help but identify with the characters in the story so we feel what they feel.

8. Children who read do better at school.

Reading assists children in all subject areas. The more we read the more knowledgeable we become!

9. Reading is a great form of entertainment.

You'll never be lonely or bored if you have a book to read.

10. Reading relaxes the body and calms the mind. These days we seem to have forgotten how to relax and how to be silent. Constant movement, flashing lights and noise, which bombard our senses when we're watching TV, looking at a computer or playing an electronic game, are actually quite stressful for our brains.
