Dear St Finbar's Community,

As a Catholic school community we believe that every individual is unique and formed in the image of our Lord. We accept that at times we are all sinners who are in need of forgiveness. It is with this belief in mind that we form our interactions with the children in our care. St Finbar's have been involved in a program called PBS4L. As part of this program we provide clear expectations of behaviour. We have three areas that we address every day, "Be Safe", "Be a learner" and "Be Responsible". Over the last couple of weeks the whole school has been focusing on "Being Safe". We have a mantra that the children say to remind them of what this could look like - "Don't be a bystander, be an upstander". We encourage the children to be proactive when interacting with their peers, we ask them to intervene if they see someone treating someone in an inappropriate manner by saying "STOP" and encourage them to go and get a teacher straight away. The school now has a tracking system so that records are kept for incidents that occur. These are called the "blue note". Teachers complete this form and it is passed on to a member of the Leadership Team who always act on these referrals.

READING AT ST FINBAR'S

Over the coming weeks we will be learning about another very important comprehension strategy called INFERRING.

Inferring is being able to 'read between the lines', when the author implies something but doesn't exactly state it. To infer, we need to use both the clues in the text (context, illustrations, etc.) and our own prior knowledge. By using the text and our prior knowledge, we can interpret what we think the author is really trying to say.

We can make inferences at word level too, by using the context of the text and our own prior knowledge to infer the meaning of the word.

Inferring is closely related to predicting.

How does inferring support reading comprehension?

Students develop deeper understanding of the text when they 'read between the lines' to draw their own conclusions by using prior experience. They create their own unique meaning of the text. As they read, these understandings may be revised as the reader is exposed to new information and confirms or adjusts their thinking.

- I wonder if . . .

FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

Helping your child with - counting

One of the first experiences children have with numbers is 'counting'. Counting starts as learning a pattern of words, just like a nursery rhyme. As children's counting develops, they begin to relate words to a quantity or number of things.

How do children learn to count and use numbers?

Children learn the pattern of counting words by repetition. Initially, this pattern may have gaps where the child leaves out a number in a sequence, or the child may invent numbers. It is common to hear a child say twenty-ten after counting to twenty-nine.

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However, remembering the words for each number in the correct order is only part of the process of counting. To 'count' children need to match saying the number words with the correct number of 'things'.

Children should be given lots of opportunities to practice and explore counting groups as well as making groups. Children also need to recognise and name numbers.

In the next newsletter, we will explore what you can do at home to help your children develop early counting skills.


