Dear St Finbar's Community,

Welcome back to Term 4 2015, where has the year gone? I trust that you were able to find some time as a family to relax over the holiday break. I had a wonderful time visiting Floriade and Bowral with my family, enjoying the wonders of nature as well as high tea and a trip to the day spa!

While some of you were enjoying an extra day with your family on Tuesday, the staff have been hard at work analysing our SMART data and setting directions and goals for 2016. We had so much to celebrate with our NAPLAN.

The table below reflects the work that all teachers and students have been doing across Literacy and Numeracy over the past year and a half. This table provides percentages on children who are below minimum standards (bottom two bands in NAPLAN). The School - represents St Finbar's, the State means the whole of NSW. The 3 represents Year 3, The 5 represents Year 5 and the 7 represents our children who have left St Finbar's last year.

These results are outstanding. While we are pleased with our results we want to be on a cycle of continued improvement. We have identified some specific areas within Reading, Writing and Numeracy which we want to address in 2016.

These include;

Writing: We want to address sentence structure and paragraphing. We want students to be able to produce grammatically correct, structurally sound and meaningful sentences. We aim to develop compound and complex sentences in our writing that show control over a range of different structures(quality, quantity and variety)

Reading: We have identified the need to refine cohesion in reading. This means being able to link ideas back to early parts of a text. We would achieve this through exploring vocabulary and extending our summarising and scanning skills when reading.

Numeracy:The staff identified the need to expand the strategies that can be used to solve a problem in Numeracy. This would be achieved by exploring rich, open - ended tasks that have a number of possible ways to solve the problem.

We concluded last term with an enjoyable concert presented by Andrew Chinn and the very talented students from St Finbar's. I am sure that those who attended this event were amazed with the range and quality of talent we have at St Finbar's. Andrew Chinn is also such an amazing, vibrant and spiritual performer. We thank Andrew for sharing his talents with us and spreading the message of the Gospel through song and movement.

READING AT ST FINBAR'S

Over the coming weeks the teachers will be working with the students to build their capacity to summarise a variety of texts. Summarising is a strategy that assists students in comprehending what they read.

A summary is a shortened version of the original text which includes all the main ideas and important details and is structurally similar to the original text.

It is one of the most difficult strategies to master and one of the hardest to teach.

Effective teaching of summarising requires multiple modelling sessions and many opportunities for students to practise. However, it is worth persisting with, as it is an extremely useful strategy for students to master as they go on to study at higher levels.

When we ask students to summarise, we often find that they copy out big chunks of text, include unimportant details, or write too much or too little. Students need explicit teaching in order to become proficient at summarising. They need to be able to:

- identify the main idea/s
- use key information
- take notes
- retell a shortened version of the text in their own words

What is the difference between retelling and summarising?

Retelling and summarising are related but not exactly the same.

Retelling is orally restating what the student remembers of the text. It is the beginning stage of summarising and is an important informal assessment tool, particularly for younger students. It requires that students reprocess the text, thinking about the sequence of ideas/events and their importance. Retelling has many benefits for both the student and teacher.

For the student, it:

- provides an opportunity to share what they have read
- reinforces the structure of the text type or genre that is being retold
- provides practice in sequencing the text
- develops oral language skills
- provides variety from being asked questions.

For the teacher, it:

- is a valuable informal assessment tool that requires little preparation.

In order to summarise, the students must attend closely to the text and be able to include information that gives the essence of the text.
