Dear St Finbar's Community

This past Sunday we celebrated All Saints Day and on Monday we celebrated All Souls Day. What does that mean to us as Catholics living in 2015? The homily given by Fr David, my Parish Priest at Oran Park answered this question for me and he did so by retelling this story.

A teacher wanted her students to learn more about the Saints so she took her students on an excursion to the cathedral to study the stained-glass windows featuring Mary, Joseph and other Saints. She showed the children the baptismal font and explained that this is like the front door to the church as this is where we welcome new members into God's house. The children were a bit confused at first but on reflection they understood the symbolism associated with this explanation.

The next feature that the class explored was the altar. The children discussed that this symbolised the Last Supper and Jesus gathering with the disciples on Holy Thursday. After exploring a few other features of the cathedral the class approached the beautiful stained glass windows.

The teacher asked if the children knew who the saint was and they answered correctly. The next response from a student was the one that really impressed the teacher and infact taught the teacher a lesson - a student replied 'A saint is a person that allows God's light to shine through them". "Wow" was the teacher's response, "Yes that is exactly right, a saint is someone who allows Christ's light to shine through them". Fr David went on to explain that is doesn't matter how old or young a person is, we all are saints and have the privilege as Catholics to allow Christ's light to shine through us just as that witnessed by the children at the cathedral. How have I allowed Christ's Light to shine through me this week? Do I shine my light with everyone or just those who I choose to associate with? Do I encourage my children to let their light shine in their interactions with other children? The big lesson in all of this is also that we are **all** saints each and every day both with our strengths and failings.

This homily had a profound impact on me and I hope that in some way this may have challenged your thinking and presented a challenge for us all in our daily lives.

We have been fortunate enough to celebrate yet another exciting fete last Friday evening. This event required hours of preparation. We sincerely thank all those involved in this organisation under the leadership of Tania De La Mare. Thank you to all members of the community who supported by volunteering time and resources.

We have received notification from Mr Pospischil that he will not be returning to St Finbar's next year. We thank him for all that he has contributed to the St Finbar's Community and wish him well for his future. We will formally farewell David at the end of year mass.

We have appointed a new Assistant Principal who will commence next year. We congratulate Mrs Lisa Samojlowicz on her appointment. Lisa is a passionate, instructional leader with a wealth of

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## **PIRLS**

PIRLS (Progress in International Reading Literacy Study) is an assessment of reading comprehension that has been monitoring trends in student achievement at five-year intervals since 2001. PIRLS represents the worldwide standard for reading comprehension of students at the Grade 4 level.

Every five years, PIRLS provides internationally comparative data about how well children from different countries read after four years of primary schooling. PIRLS also provides extensive information about home supports for literacy and school environments for teaching and learning.

Reading literacy is the foundation for student academic success and personal growth, and PIRLS is a valuable vehicle for studying whether new or revised educational policies impact achievement. PIRLS 2016 will be the fourth assessment since 2001, providing trends in reading achievement over a 15-year period. A total of 55 countries from around the world participate in this assessment.

Our Year 4 students will take part in this assessment tomorrow. It will begin at 9:15am and we wish them all the very best.


