In this newsletter I want to share with you some ideas of a homily that my Parish Priest shared with us. This homily was actually life changing for me as it made me reflect on how fortunate we are to be part of a safe environment in Glenbrook and the opportunities we have to reach our potential each day. This also comes in light of the recent events in Barcelona, where a student from CEDP tragically lost his life in the incident that took place. Below is a summary of the key points from the homily shared by Fr David at St Mary MacKillop Parish at Oran Park.

Imagine if every morning I was to say to you that you will get \$86,400!

The \$86,400 you get in the morning is gone in the evening. You can't use any of it in advance and you can't pile it up.

What would you do? Would you think carefully about how you'd use it every day? Would you keep it all for yourself, would you share it with others?

The thing is, we all have this account available to us as Catholics, it is the gift of life from God — except the difference is we get something much better than money - it's time - we get time and opportunities. We all have 86,400 seconds to spend every day, and at the end of the day, they're gone.

How do you choose to spend these 86 400 seconds?

You can't live in the future; you can't live in the past. You live in the present. Using the seconds available to you right now.

Find magic in the little things.

Stop dwelling on the past; now, this is really a waste of time. Yes, learning from our past is a good thing, but not dwelling.

Stop trying to be perfect all the time - life is messy.

When you have work to do at school, work or home, that seems pointless or difficult, see if you can make them more effective or more meaningful.

Think about the seconds every morning when you wake up and ask yourself: How will I use my time assets today?



# From the Assistant Principal

At Monday's Assembly I spoke to our community about the importance and power of saying hello. It is 5 little letters that can make an incredible difference to our lives and the lives of others.

I recalled when I went to school how it was almost compulsory for students to ensure they said good morning Brother, good morning Miss or good morning Sir, as they moved around the school. Although it was something that was engrained in all of us early on, it never felt like it was a chore. It was a simple way for all of us, in our school community, to build relationships with one another.



When we greet each other we are saying, I recognise you. You are important. That you deserve to be acknowledged.

We belong to a community and at times we can take each other for granted. We need to ensure that we are making connections with one another, building relationships that can help to create safe and supportive learning communities that acknowledge the strong interconnections between students, teachers and families.

Research supports that when a caring, respectful and supportive teaching and learning community is present, harassment, aggression, violence and bullying is less likely to occur. Student safety and wellbeing is enhanced when students feel connected to their school, have positive and respectful relationships with their peers and teachers and feel confident about their social and emotional skills.

The first step to ensuring that we are connected is simple.
