Dear St Finbar's Community

Last term, we commenced a review of our student wellbeing policy, Positive Behaviour System for Learning (PBS4L).

From this review, we were able to identify some key areas that needed to be addressed. One such area was our PBS4L Matrix. The PBS4L Matrix is a guiding and supporting document that assists students to understand what safe, respectful and learning behaviours look like across the school. Our current matrix was too cumbersome and not

student friendly.

Towards the end of last term, staff, parents and students met to refine and update our matrix. We also encouraged students to submit designs for a new mascot. I would like to thank Roary Evans who submitted a dove as his design. He wanted PBS4L to be underpinned by the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit, highlighting the importance of peace and our connection with God. We also had a number of students who submitted designs for a possum. Using their ideas we have created our new mascot, PBS4L Possum.

It is the schools expectation that every student will attend school in correct uniform. Students are required to attend school in full Summer (Term 1 & 4) or Winter Uniform (Term 2 & 3) or in Sports Uniform for days that have been gazetted for sport. This information is provided to families in the school Curriculum Overview Letter, which will be provided to families tomorrow.

We understand that, from time to time, students may not have parts of their uniform due to extenuating circumstances. On these occasions, we would ask that you please provide a note explaining the reason why.



#### Our Parent Handbook states:

Upon enrolment at St Finbar's, parents undertake to support the school's policies and codes of conduct the implementation of school uniform procedures is one such area. Parent support of this, in the home, is requested, if we are to truly work in partnership.

If your child is not wearing correct school uniform, and a letter of explanation has not been received, we will let you know that an item of uniform needs to be addressed. This communication also includes letters pertaining to inappropriate hairstyles and hair lengths.

If you require any assistance, to supply your child with the appropriate items for their uniform, you are more than welcome to contact me.

BOYS' (SUMMER)

- Blue/short sleeve logo shirt
- Grey shorts (Polyester / rayon)
- Grey socks plain
- Black leather school shoes

#### BOYS' (WINTER)

- School navy sloppy joe with emblem
- School fleecy jacket
- Blue logo shirt
- Long grey Polyester/rayon college trousers
- Grey socks
- Black leather school shoes

#### BOYS' SPORT

- School polo shirt with emblem
- School hat
- Navy blue sport shorts
- Navy blue tracksuit pants
- White socks
- Sandshoes/sneakers

#### GIRLS' SUMMER

- Blue check school dress
- Navy Blue short socks
- Black leather school shoes

#### GIRLS' WINTER

- School Navy sloppy joe with emblem
- School Fleecy jacket
- Culottes
- Pale blue short sleeve shirt with school emblem
- Navy tights
- Black leather school shoes

GIRLS' SPORT SUNDRY ITEMS

- School polo shirt with emblem
- School hat
- Navy shorts or School navy tracksuit pants
- White socks
- Sandshoes/sneakers
   Please not the tights/leggings are not part of the sports uniform.

#### ADDITIONAL AREAS

- Nail polish is not allowed
- Only plain stud earrings or sleepers can be worn, and only one earring in each ear
- Jewellery may only include a signet ring or one religious symbol on a necklace
- Note: Jewellery guidelines are established for student safety in the playground and on the play equipment, and to safeguard from the loss of special items



- Hair should be clean and tidy and long hair at collar length must be tied back with ribbons of the school colours (sky blue, navy or maroon). Hair colouring is not appropriate for school times. This rule applies to all students
- No hair ornaments are permissible e.g. beads, additional extensions, decorative clips, flowers
- Cargo shorts and cargo pants are not part of the school uniform
- Black school shoes must be lace ups or buckles/Velcro. This is a safety matter on our site, due to stairs

#### **Edward Sri Conference**

Last week Mrs Donna McFadzean, Mrs Alicia Borg and myself had the privilege of attending a two day conference with Dr Edward Sri, a world renowned scripture scholar. The conference was part of the ongoing commitment to staff formation and professional development by the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta.

Dr Sri is a theologian who leads pilgrimages to Rome and the Holy Land every year and whose teachings call and inspire all members of the Catholic faith to *live* their faith in daily life. Dr Sri is a passionate advocate for making faith relevant and central to the lives of our youth and actively invites audiences to engage in a range of contemporary issues via his website, publications, podcasts and pilgrimages.

The theme for the conference was 'Who do you say I am?' (Mk 8:27) with the main focus being Mark's Gospel. Dr Sri broke down the themes and symbolism in Mark's gospel, linking it closely to the Old Testament, as well as expanding the theme across all four Gospels. He presented with remarkable energy, and and left us all feeling acutely aware of the profound presence of Christ in our lives.


#### Parish Mass every Tuesday
