One year's growth for ones year's learning. This is the catchphrase that changed the narrative for teachers. That student achievement is important, but it should not be the measure of success. Growth is the measure of success, as it clearly links to personal bests and highlights the importance of tracking success against yourself and not the cohort.

Everyday, I am lucky enough to visit learning spaces blessed with teachers that personalise the learning to help students strive for their personal best and help them to achieve one year's growth and beyond.

I am lucky enough to see learners challenge themselves and climb through the learning pit to find success on the other side. To witness them grow emotionally, socially, spiritually and academically. So, this week I write to the learners and thank them for the wonderful growth we see each day, week, month and term in your class.

To Kinder, I love seeing you challenge yourself when you investigate problems in Mathematics. You amaze your teachers with your thinking and how you develop new and efficient strategies. I love seeing how the quality of your writing is improving. Your literacy skills are developing each day and you have grown so much this year.

To Year 1, I love that you use thinking time to plan your writing. I can see how your use of visual images help you create new and imaginative ideas. I can see how your writing has grown this year, as you challenge yourself to try out new words and improve your vocabulary.

To Year 2, I love that your investigations in Science this term meant that you had to learn from your mistakes. That when you developed your solutions to solve the problem, you understood what needed to change to improve the result. It highlighted the cyclical nature of learning and that when we learn something new, we evaluate our understanding and deepen our knowledge.

To Year 3, I love that you can self-reflect on your learning. That you can identify your learning goals and monitor where you need to go next. You are not afraid to climb through the learning pit and along the way stop and reflect on what feedback you have been given, so that you can apply what you know to new scenarios.

To Year 4, effective learners are ones that work together. I love that you have demonstrated incredible growth with your ability to work as an effective team. This term, you shown that when you work together you can achieve incredible results. In History, you had 3 hours to create a living timeline of aboriginal history. To see what you could do, together, in 3 hours highlighted how much you have grown to be effective, cooperative, interdependent learners.

To Year 5, mindset is a critical component of being a successful learner. I love that you approach every learning experience with a growth mindset. I see how you challenge yourselves and one another to



deepen you thinking in Mathematics. You ask your classmates to convince each another that their solutions are correct, as you play the skeptic to help them deepen their thinking and understanding.

To Year 6, I love that you can be critical thinkers. In Geography, you have been asked to plan a town that is sustainable, liveable and productive. To watch you solve a real-world problem, where you have had to develop new surface knowledge and then deepen this knowledge by creating physical, scale models of you town. The growth we have seen, in you, during this project tells us that you are active, invested learners.

Thank you for letting us be a part of your learning journey.

I would also like to inform the community that I will be on long service leave during Weeks 9 and 10 of Term 3. I look forward to seeing you all in Term 4.
